## French White Wines

### **9. Chateau La Berriere, Muscadet Sur Lie 2020** **£23.90**

Produced on an 18th century domaine since 1737, Located 20 km from Nantes on south-west slopes bordering the Loire aged on its lees for minimum 3 months. Elderflower and almond blossom aromas and flavours with honey and a nutty, minerally crisp finish.

### **10. Sancerre Jean-Paul Balland, Loire. 2021** **£35.90**

A wonderful dry Sauvignon with chalky mineral quality – hints of cooked apples.

### **11. Christophe Camu, Chablis, 2020** **£35.90**

Christophe Camu, 7<sup>th</sup> generation, ferments all his wines at cool temperature using natural yeasts and produces pure, crisp and mineral whites. Fresh aromas of green apple, lemon peel, and a wonderful saline minerality. Round on the palate and well-balanced with a crisp acidity. Perfect with seafood.

### **12. Gerard Thomas SAINT-AUBIN Champ Tirant 2019** **£45.00**

From a well-placed vineyard adjoining premier cru Les Castets. Fresh and fruity with lovely, honeyed chardonnay nose. This is now aged like all the premiers crus in 30% new oak barrels.

## Italian White

### **13. La Battistina GAVI di GAVI, Piedmont 2021** **£28.90**

This wine comes from Nuovo Quadro, a single vineyard site with chalky mineral soils, at the foot of the Battistina hill. Winemaking takes place at Araldica's La Battistina winery. The Cortese grapes are typically hand-harvested in mid-September, and the freshly picked grapes are gently crushed before undergoing temperature controlled fermentation in small volume stainless steel tanks. The wine remains in contact with the lees for up to 6 months before being fined, filtered and bottled.

## Portugal White

### **14. Raza Vinho Verde Branco 2020** **£23.90**

At 11.5% alcohol, Raza is a blend of Arinto (50%), Azal (35%) and Trajadura (15%). With a fizzy crispness and easy, fruity finish (9 g/l making it perceptibly just a bit off-dry, but nicely balanced by acidity), it is in a familiar style, but well done, clean and invigorating. You can't go wrong acidity lift a textured, full-flavoured palate.

## South African White

In the eleventh century, our North Tyne area was given to the Bellingham's (pronounced "Bellingjum") by Robert, the son of William the Conqueror. 800 years ago, the Charltons (who are still here) took over. We know the Bellingham's in South Africa are Dutch and they are probably from the same family. Is it pure coincidence that Bellingham shares its name with this town in South Africa?

### **15. Bellingham Chardonnay. 2016**

**£22.90**

Fresh Citrus nose which follows through to the palate. The wine has a perceptible oaky character and elegant finish.

### **16. Blockhead, Chenin Blanc 2021**

**£22.90**

Chenin Blanc can often be overcropped, producing thin, somewhat weedy wines. This wine is the exact opposite. Packed with intense flavours of fresh Bramley apples and a touch of quince jelly this is unoaked and finishes with a delicious creaminess and lovely zingy bite

## Australian White

### **17. Kirrihill, Riesling, Clair Valley 2021**

**£27.90**

Part of the Kirrihill 'Regional Series', characteristic of the region, fruit driven, soft and approachable wines. This Riesling is as refreshing as a dip in the ocean. A bright and crisp style with fragrant citrus, floral and orange blossom notes. Fresh acidity leads to a clean, dry and mouth-watering finish.

## Chilean White

### **18. Emiliana Adobe Gewurtztraminer (Organic), 2021**

**£25.90**

The nose offers floral aromas of jasmine, lychee, and honey notes. The floral notes reappear on the palate, along with apricot, and mandarin orange. Medium bodied with good concentration and a refreshing ripe fruit finish. A delightful accompaniment with our Thai dishes.

## New Zealand White

### **19. MoKoBlack Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough. 2017**

**£26.90**

This wine displays hints of passion fruit and ripe tropical aromas on the nose, with a balanced structure and dry, lingering finish.

## Rosé Wines

**5. Mirabello, Pinot Grigio Rose, Italy. £19.90**

A dry, fresh and fruity rose with delicate aromas of red berries. Crisp and lively on the palate with good intensity of ripe berry and red cherry fruit. Perfect summer drinking.

**20. Portugal Casel Mendes Rosé £22.50**

Refreshing and fruity rosé, bursting with aromas of strawberries and raspberries. A light fizz and a bit of sweetness.

**21. Whispering Angel Provence Rosé, France £36.95**

The most talked about Provence rose on the planet. Try one and see what all the fuss is about!

## Champagnes and Sparkling wines

**22. Cava Gran Gesta, Penedes, Spain £24.90**

This wonderfully lively wine has an attractive personality and is full flavoured and fruity, being a blend of 3 quality white grape varieties, all indigenous to Spain. It is a selected blend of 'Xarel.lo' (pronounced cha-re-lo), 'Macabeo' and 'Parellada'. It is light golden in colour, with delicate small bubbles. The aromas are powerful and fruity, reminiscent of flowers and honey. Perfect on its own, or served with canapes, and first courses.

**23. Champagne Claude Cazals France £47.90**

This basic cuvée has a racy zesty style that competes favourably with the better-known brands.

**24. Bollinger Brut NV £58.90**

Bollinger must be one of the most individually flavoured bubbliies on the market. Its character is totally original and once tasted its never forgotten. Classic yeasty flavours combine with ripe strawberry fruit to make a luxury cuvée

## French Red

**25. La Creuze Noire JULIENAS Les Clos, Beaujolais 2020** **£31.95**

The village of Julienas is named after Julius Cesar. A light bodied, fruity red with aromas of strawberry jam with tart flavours of cherries and raspberries and ever so light savoury notes. Very Classy!

**26. Domaine La Rouviole Minervois La Regence 2020** **£30.90**

A full-flavoured and perfumed wine showing notes of ripe cassis with elegant cedar and chocolate notes and a fine, velvety texture.

**27. Boutinot Les Coteaux Cotes du Rhône Villages 2020** **£23.90**

Immediately impressive, this wine reveals its class from the start. Brambly fruit underpinned by subtle oaky nuances, lovely, sweet spice - warm star anise with a touch of cinnamon. This classic Cotes du Rhône Villages is enriched with specially selected parcels from the cru vineyards of Séguret, Sablet and Cairanne.

**28. Chateau Larroque Bordeaux Superieur, 2015** **£28.95**

An award-winning Bordeaux Superior from near Graves on the left bank. Attractive oak aromas with soft cassis and black cherry fruit flavours leading onto a complex palate with good structure and fine tannins

**29. Jean-Jacques Girard Savigny-les-Beaune 1er Cru 2019** **£42.95**

Intense black and red currant fruits with a peppery edge on the nose. Soft and supple on the palate, with alluring fruitiness and a slight savoury edge. A structured Pinot Noir wine that will open up greatly after 5-10 years.

## Spanish Red

**30. Navajas, Rioja Crianza. 2017** **£23.90**

Suave and sophisticated with plum, cedar and smoky fruits. A year in oak then laid down for two years before leaving Rioja.

## Italian Red

**31. Italy Zensa Primativo (Organic), 2021** **£24.90**

Intense ruby-red colour, with a complex bouquet, reminiscent of cherries, dried berries and toasted almonds. In the mouth it is full-bodied yet smooth and elegant with a silky texture. The finish is long and lingering, with a burst of spiced cherries and bright fruit and earthiness at the end.

## Australian Red

### **32. Kirrihill, Cabernet Sauvignon, 2019** **£27.90**

Kirrihill 'Regional Series' Cabernet Sauvignon showcases all the classic elements of Clare Valley varieties. This Cabernet is a showstopper. Dark red fruits and plum aromas flirt with delicate mixed herbs and spice notes. Elegant yet generous with balanced oak flavours and fine-grained tannins.

## South African Red

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### **33. Bellingham Pinotage. 2018** **£23.90**

A medium bodied wine with an intense fruity flavour

## Chilean Red

### **34. Kalfu Molu Pinot Noir 2020** **£23.90**

Deep and intense ruby red with violet hints. This is fruity and expressive, its cherry and raspberries notes complemented with a soft, spicy character and a vanilla touch from the oak ageing

## Argentinean Red

### **35. Argentina La Gran Bestia Malbec Bonarda, 2021** **£22.90**

No myth or legend here. Instead, a real big beast of a wine from the Mendoza Valley, Argentina. Deep, brooding and dark. Big fruit, big spice, big flavours.

## Moldovan Red

### **36. Freedom Blend 2020 (supporting Ukraine!)** **£36.90**

Freedom Blend is the expression of the free spirit, a courageous blend, full of character, from three indigenous grape varieties. It has the heart of Georgia, the terroir of Moldova, and the free spirit of Ukraine.

The intense ruby colour and almond accents produce a complex bouquet dominated by cherries, blackberries, and currants, complemented by dried plums, red pepper, and savoury notes of moist wood and leather. The full and fruity taste captures the elegance and refinement and gives a velvet aftertaste

# Half bottles

## White

### **37. Kim Crawford Sauvignon Blanc New Zealand 2017**

**£17.90**

This Sauvignon Blanc is pale straw with lemon hues. Lifted aromas of passion fruit and guava dominate the nose, along with notes of citrus and crushed herbs and an underlying wet stone minerality. The wine has vibrant acidity, with plenty of palate weight and length. Ripe, tropical fruit flavours of passion fruit, melon and grapefruit linger on the persistent finish.

## Red

### **38. Allegrini Valpolicella 2020**

**£19.90**

This wine is ruby red in colour, with youthful highlights. Fragrant fruit with prominent notes of dark cherries is echoed by fresher hints of pepper and aromatic herbs, typical of Corvina and its genetic cousin Corvinone, the historic varieties of this appellation. This Valpolicella is impressively lively and playful on the palate, whilst exhibiting delicacy and finesse at the same time.

### **39. Navajas, Rioja Crianza 2019**

**£14.90**

Suave and sophisticated with plum, cedar and smoky fruits. A year in oak then laid down for two years before leaving Rioja
